9 Cyberport Start-ups Named Hong Kong Technology Fast 20 and Rising Stars by Deloitte

A strong recognition of attractive business models and high potential of the fast-growing technology companies

Hong Kong, 28 September 2017 – Cyberport is proud to announce that Deloitte named six Cyberport start-ups Hong Kong's Technology Fast 20 (TF20) and three as Rising Stars. The inaugural awards in Hong Kong are a part of the Deloitte Technology Fast Program, which has been the golden benchmark worldwide for fast-growing high technology companies since 1995, is one of the most recognising awards for companies with exemplary business models and strong growth potential. Cyberport companies GOGO VAN, Privé Managers, AfterShip, Skytree, Mydress.com and iLearners have been selected as the TF20 winners, while Klook, TNG Wallet and ORII are named Rising Stars.

The start-ups selected by the Program represent an array of industries from e-commerce, FinTech, AI, and wearables to hardware, biotech, and media. They reflect the diversity of Hong Kong's start-ups and manifest the economic potential of new economy companies.

Speaking at the award presentation ceremony, Dr Lee George Lam, Chairman of Cyberport, said, "We are glad to be a Strategic Partner of Deloitte in this prestigious programme. The awards are a strong affirmation of our start-ups' ingenuity and achievements. We are proud that the winners include many high-flying Cyberport start-ups. As the enabler of Hong Kong's digital technology ecosystem, Cyberport is committed to providing a full range of support to our start-ups to help them become global brands and to springboard them to greater success in the new economy."

GOGO VAN is Cyberport's first unicorn and an early alumnus of Cyberport Incubation Programme. The company achieved a growth rate up to 30 times over the past 3 years, earning it the third spot in the TF20. Steven Lam, CEO, said, "We are thrilled about winning the award. Following the merger with 58 Suyun last month, we will expand our service area in mainland China, making us the largest intra-city logistics platform in Asia covering 110 cities. We would not have achieved such rapid growth without the loving support of our home city. We are especially grateful to Cyberport for its incubation programme that kick started our company four years ago. We are proud to be a Hong Kong start-up, and we are positive about the prospects of Hong Kong's digital tech companies in the region and around the world."

Alex Kong, the founder and CEO of Rising Star award winner TNG, also joined Cyberport Incubation Programme, was grateful for the recognition. "Hong Kong is an excellent launch pad for FinTech start-ups, and the city is primed for FinTech success," he said. "We are glad to have started up in Hong Kong and to have received Cyberport's continued dedicated support since we launched the e-wallet in 2013. With the recent HK\$900 million (US\$115 million) Series A round investment, TNG will further enrich our service portfolio and expand into new markets. Last week,

we successfully signed a deal with a UK company to bring our FinTech solutions to UK market and beyond. Now our footprint spans 14 markets. Hong Kong's FinTech potentials abound. With Cyberport's efforts in fostering the FinTech ecosystem, we are certain there will be many more successful, fast-growing start-ups to come.”

Winners of the TF20 will automatically enter this year's National China TF50 Program and compete with other contestants across China. Many past winners of the TF50 have since become global technology giants, such as most notably Tencent, Baidu, and Alibaba.
