The All-new Smart-Space 8 by Cyberport Opens in Tsuen Wan

The first off-campus co-working space to offer comprehensive incubation support to young entrepreneurs

Hong Kong – 26 July 2018 – Cyberport is committed to cultivating talent, fostering digital transformation and promoting integration of the new and traditional economy through a series of incubation programmes and value-added services to digital technology start-ups. Chief Executive Mrs Carrie Lam announced the launch of the “Space Sharing Scheme for Youth” in the Policy Address last October. Under the great support from the Hong Kong SAR Government, and HKR International, Cyberport today opened its eighth co-working space in Tsuen Wan. Located at CDW Building in Tsuen Wan town centre, Smart Space 8 represents Cyberport’s first co-working space outside of the Pokfulam campus. It also plays a strategic role in bringing Cyberport’s decade-long experience, network and resources in nurturing start-ups and industry talent to the wider community, encouraging entrepreneurship across the city and empowering young entrepreneurs to realise their dreams.

All-round Incubation Support for Start-ups

As a pioneer of co-working space in Hong Kong, Cyberport launched its first Smart-Space in 2009 and has created a vibrant community of digital technology entrepreneurs since then. In addition to the offering of office space, the Smart-Space also provides the essential atmosphere and ecosystem for like-minded innovators to get connected, share ideas and exchange insights. The Smart-Space has become home to companies in various digital technology fields including e-sports/digital entertainment, FinTech, AI/Big Data, Smart City/Smart Living and Blockchain applications which make Cyberport a vibrant community and an ideal place for entrepreneurs to start up their business.

Covering an approximate area of 20,000 square feet, the brand-new Smart-Space 8, same as all other Smart-Space on the Cyberport campus, offers various supporting services to start-ups and young entrepreneurs, such as one-stop incubation programmes, in order to help them lay down business foundation and accelerate their growth. These programmes include Cyberport Creative Micro Fund, Cyberport Incubation Programme, Cyberport Accelerator Support Programme, Cyberport Macro Fund and so on. Through comprehensive support and services, Cyberport encourages innovation and entrepreneurship among the young generation, inspiring them to develop novel ideas and smart solutions riding on the power of technology.

Mr Matthew Cheung Kin-chung, Chief Secretary for Administration of the Hong Kong SAR Government said, “We are in the golden age of entrepreneurship. ‘Space Sharing Scheme for Youth’ has created a multi-functional, creative space to help these innovators realise their entrepreneurial dreams. With its extensive network, Smart-Space 8 by Cyberport in Tsuen Wan will bring numerous opportunities to a whole new breed of start-ups in Hong Kong.”

Dr Lee George Lam, Chairman of Cyberport said, “The launch of Smart-Space 8 marks a significant milestone for Cyberport. Smart-Space in Cyberport has been supporting digital technology start-ups for almost a decade. We have witnessed the success of many exceptional start-ups and have strived to progress along with them. Smart-Space 8 symbolises Cyberport’s efforts in going beyond our home campus and bringing our extensive network and resources from the Southern District to the New Territories West. With this new town centre and enriched supporting services, we look forward to serving young entrepreneurs from different districts. Smart-Space 8 is our 8th co-working space. It is also our first off-campus centre. We are eager to get connected with the wider community to promote innovation and technology with the continuous support from the society.”

Smart-Space 8 is located at CDW Building, which is adjacent to the Tsuen Wan MTR station. It is accessible with convenient transportation links to the rest of Hong Kong. The co-working space can accommodate 142 start-ups and has received enthusiastic response since it was first opened for application in June 2018. Among the applicants are digital technology companies engaged in a variety of fields, such as game development, FinTech, EduTech, HealthTech, big data, app development, e-commerce and wearable technology.

Entrepreneurs who wish to join the Cyberport and Smart-Space 8 community are welcome to submit applications via the online system (<https://ss8.cyberport.hk>). For applications by individuals, applicants must be aged between 18 and 35. For company applicants, one of the founders must be aged between 18 and 35 while the company itself should not have been in operation for longer than seven years.
