2025 'Maker in China' Hong Kong Chapter Open for Enrolment

National-Level Entrepreneurship Contest Supports Start-ups in Exploring
Mainland Market Opportunities

Hong Kong, 9 July 2025 — The 2025 "Maker in China" SME Innovation and Entrepreneurship Global Contest – Hong Kong Chapter (Hong Kong Chapter), one of China's most globally influential innovation and entrepreneurship contests, is now open for enrolment starting today, with a deadline of 20 August. The Hong Kong Chapter Final will be held on 25 September this year. The top 3 winning teams will represent the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (HKSAR) at the "Maker in China" Global Contest Final in Guangzhou in the fourth quarter of this year, competing for national-level international innovation and technology (I&T) honours and seizing valuable opportunities to expand into the Mainland market by connecting with investors and establishing a presence in Mainland entrepreneurial parks.

The top 10 finalists in the Hong Kong Chapter will receive comprehensive professional support, including participation in international I&T exhibitions, eligibility for an interview with the "Cyberport Incubation Programme", meetings with investors, and access to multiple start-up accelerator programmes, serving as a dynamic springboard for start-ups to secure potential funding and expand into the Mainland and overseas markets.

The Hong Kong Chapter 2025 encompasses 10 I&T categories, namely FinTech, AI and Big Data, Intelligent Device and Robotics, Smart Living and Smart Mobility, Third Generation Internet and Metaverse, Semiconductor and Integrated Circuit, Biomedicine and Health, Low-altitude Economy and Aerospace, New Energy and Green Technology, as well as New Materials.
