Cyberport Launches New "Digital Tech Centre"

Providing a Platform for Public to Experience Cutting-Edge Technology and Driving Its Widespread Adoption in Hong Kong

Hong Kong, 16 April 2025 – Cyberport officially launched its new "**Digital Tech Centre**" (the "Centre"), now open to enterprises and the public. The Centre provides an exceptional platform to showcase the innovative achievements of Cyberport's community companies, allowing visitors to experience firsthand how artificial intelligence (AI), blockchain, Web3.0 and other cutting-edge technologies are being integrated into daily life. The Centre offers an immersive journey into the future through engaging interactive displays and real-world scenario applications, demonstrating the tangible benefits of "technology for the people."

Cyberport held the opening ceremony and open day for the Centre today (16 April). **Ir Tony Wong, Commissioner for Digital Policy**, officiated at the opening ceremony. It allows startups to showcase their achievements in I&T, fostering a thriving I&T ecosystem. For the public, the Centre offers firsthand experience with applications like health tech and sports tech, enhancing their understanding of the various benefits that I&T brings to daily life. Beyond citizens and SMEs, the products and solutions showcased at the Centre have also garnered interest from government departments, helping to optimize public services. We thank our startup community and I&T leaders for their continuous creativity and drive for change, enabling a wide range of solutions to be transformed into practical applications through this platform, thereby accelerating the digital transformation of all sectors in the society and making a valuable contribution to the development of Hong Kong's digital economy."

The Digital Tech Centre utilises interactive exhibits to allow the public to experience firsthand how innovation and technology are transforming daily life. The Centre features three themed zones: "**Efficiency**", "**Security**" and "**Interactive Experience**", showcasing a range of solutions from 17 Cyberport community members. These solutions leverage AI, blockchain, and other advanced technologies in areas such as education, healthcare, and smart city applications. The aim is to promote industry exchange and help companies transcend industry boundaries to explore more innovative application scenarios. Featured exhibits include INF AI MED from INF Hong Kong, a personal AI doctor which supports health consultations, medical report interpretation, and personalised healthcare recommendations, helping the public understand their personal health status at a low cost; The Skynet Leaderboard from CertiK, which presents security ratings for over 10,000 Web3.0 projects in just seconds, integrating on-chain and off-chain data to quickly grasp project risks and comprehensively enhance the transparency and trustworthiness of blockchain investments; Allium Technology's BAL Cognitive Training Platform, which connects physical props with the system to enable cognitive training for dementia patients through simple games, along with data analysis to monitor progress and maintain cognitive health; and HealthMaxx from XonLabs, an AI-powered health management application that uses intelligent food recognition and personalised analysis to reshape the health tracking experience.

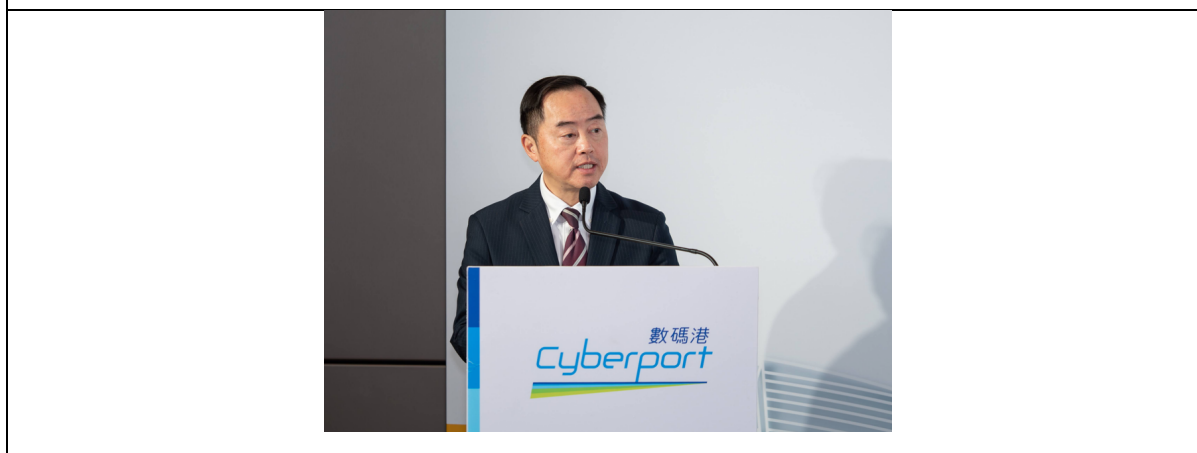

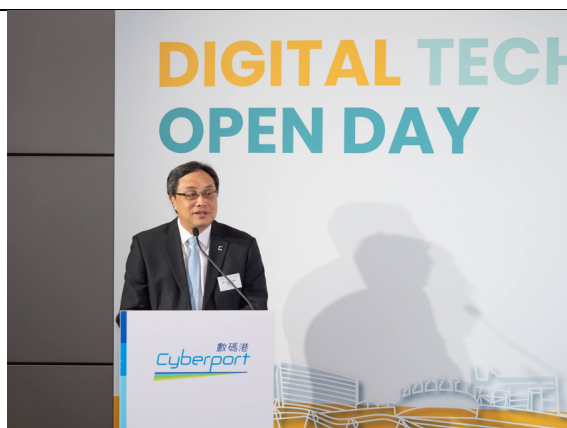
