Bridging Innovation Ecosystems Across Regions to Build Platforms for R&D, Talent, and Industry

Hong Kong, 5 June 2025 – The Hong Kong Branch of The National Torch Academy of Innovation and Entrepreneurship (Zhongguancun) (HKNTAIE) officially held its opening and plaque unveiling ceremony at Cyberport yesterday (4 June), marking a significant step in fostering collaboration on innovation talent cultivation and enterprise incubation between the two regions. The ceremony was officiated by Lillian Cheong, Acting Secretary for Innovation, Technology and Industry, and Zhang Ruobing, Director of the Beijing Municipal Talent Work Bureau. It was witnessed by various distinguished guests, including Zhong Weigong, Standing Committee Member and Director of Organisation Department of the Beijing Daxing District Party Committee; Elizabeth Lee, Chairman of HKNTAIE and Chairman of the Hong Kong Alumni Association of Beijing Universities (HKAABJU); Simon Chan, Chairman of Cyberport; and Dr Rocky Cheng, CEO of Cyberport. Following the ceremony, the guests toured the office facilities of HKNTAIE and engaged in discussions with representatives from around 20 inaugural tenant companies to understand their latest business developments.

HKNTAIE is an international innovative offshore industry incubation and acceleration platform. It also serves as a practical platform for cultivating talent in core technology innovation and entrepreneurship, as well as a national-level significant platform dedicated to the deep incubation of major innovative technologies. It is committed to accelerating R&D outcomes and results transformation and focusing on nurturing high-level tech entrepreneurial talent proficient in technology, market-oriented, and skilled in management and cultivating world-class core technology enterprises. This effort will further accelerate Hong Kong's development of new quality productive forces and contribute innovative momentum to the country's high quality development. Currently, the HKNTAIE has introduced approximately 55 outstanding I&T companies from the Beijing-Tianjin-Hebei region to set up base in the Cyberport Campus, covering areas such as AI, aerospace technology, biomedicine, blockchain, and smart cities.

Lillian Cheong, Acting Secretary for Innovation, Technology and Industry, said, "HKNTAIE, as a national-level significant accelerator for technology outcome transfer and



transformation, shouldering the important mission of connecting talents and innovation and technology resources between Beijing and Hong Kong, serving both places and radiating globally to cultivate and develop new quality productive forces. She added that Hong Kong, under the 'One Country, Two Systems' principle, has unique advantages of "enjoying strong support of the Motherland and being closely connected to the world". Hong Kong is promoting and strengthening the efficient collaboration among the government, industry, academia, research and investment sectors, fully utilising its unique roles as a 'superconnector' and 'super value-adder' in helping Mainland enterprises to "go global and attract foreign investment". The Innovation, Technology and Industry Bureau of the HKSAR Government will continue to assist more Mainland enterprises in coming to Hong Kong for development."

Zhang Ruobing, Director of the Beijing Municipal Talent Work Bureau, said, "The official establishment of the HKNTAIE marks another important achievement in jointly building a national high-level talent hub in Beijing and Hong Kong. These leading enterprises are focused on frontier technologies including Al and big data. With strong support from the HKSAR Government, the HKAABJU and Cyberport will continue to drive more outstanding enterprises to settle in Cyberport, further enhancing the innovation ecosystem and promoting enterprise growth.

As Hong Kong's digital technology hub and Al accelerator, Cyberport will continue to promote innovation and entrepreneurship, leveraging its role as a gateway connecting Mainland China and the world, and serving as a successful springboard for enterprises to "bring in" global innovation and "go out" to international markets.


