Hong Kong, 23 March 2026 – The Cyberport Entrepreneurship Programme Graduation Ceremony was successfully held last Friday at Cyberport, celebrating the graduation of more than 200 start-ups from the Cyberport Incubation Programme (CIP) and Cyberport Creative Micro Fund (CCMF). Cyberport proactively supports start-ups at early stages of their development through comprehensive training and mentoring, resources allocation, and financial assistance, empowering them to transform innovative ideas into market-ready solutions. At the same time, Cyberport actively helps start-ups scale their business by facilitating access to strategic investment opportunities and fostering valuable business partnerships and expanding their presence across Hong Kong and globally.

This year, among the 202 graduating start-ups, 98 are from the Cyberport Incubation

Programme (CIP) while 104 are from the Cyberport Creative Micro Fund (CCMF). In the field of Artificial Intelligence (AI) sector, notable graduates include R2C2 Limited, which has received multiple industry awards and recognitions, including the Honoree title in the Robotics category at the 2025 CES Innovation Awards and the Bronze Award at the HKICT Awards 2024 (Hardware and Devices). The company has also collaborated with corporates on proptech, construction technology and robotics projects. Another standout is Sourcy Global, an AI-powered global sourcing platform with strong presence in Southeast Asia, which has established a branch office in Qianhai.

In the field of FinTech, graduated start-ups include Endowus, an award-winning independent fee-only wealth and fund platform; and Long Bridge Technology HK, which has developed a comprehensive digital solution fully integrated with the Hong Kong stock trading system and serves over 100 brokerage and securities firms. In the Web3.0 space, standout start-ups include Smartdeer, an International HR services platform offering end-to end global Web3 talent acquisition solutions; Omni HR, an HR operations platform which has expanded into more than 15 Asian markets; HashNut, which focuses on digital asset payment solutions backed by 78 invention patents; Beosin Technology, a leading blockchain compliance and security company; Hong Kong VAX, which is building a smart, safe, seamless and secure digital asset ecosystem; and SlowMist, a blockchain security firm specialising in digital asset trading platforms and broader ecosystem security. In the smart living sector, King Kong Mini Storage operates more than 70 self-storage facilities across five major Mainland cities.

Cyberport also invited Amazon Web Services and EY Parthenon to share insights at a panel session titled “The Founder’s Playbook: What to Know for 2026 and Beyond”. The session provided guidance on entrepreneurship, helping graduating start-ups gain a clearer understanding of emerging technology and business trends shaping 2026 and beyond. It also offered valuable insights into sustainable growth, along with professional strategies for market-entry, developing local business plan for future development, and preparing for global scaling. At the same time, Bowtie, a Cyberport InsurTech Company and the first to be granted a virtual insurance license in Hong Kong, powered the “Beyond Graduation: Connect & Celebrate” networking session. The event provided newly graduated start-ups with opportunities to connect, explore potential collaborations, and expand their business networks.

As Hong Kong’s digital tech hub and AI accelerator, Cyberport has been actively nurturing tech talent and incubating start-ups, to support technology R&D, innovation, and application. Through these efforts, it drives digital transformation and intelligent upgrade across industries and society, fostering industrial innovation and integrated development. Leveraging Hong Kong’s dual role as a “super-connector” and “super value-adder”, Cyberport supports start-ups in scaling both locally and globally by connecting pooling talent, technologies, and capital.
