**Cyberport Partners with Hong Kong Police Force for  
"Tech for All: Generational Skills Challenge"  
Collaborating with Start-ups to Promote Intergenerational Digital Inclusion**

**Hong Kong, 1 February 2026** – Cyberport and the Hong Kong Island Region of Hong Kong Police yesterday hosted the **"Tech for All: Generational Skills Challenge" Challenge Day and Closing Ceremony** at Cyberport. The carnival-style event featured innovative solutions from Cyberport community start-ups in HealthTech, SportsTech, and EdTech, drawing over 160 participants including members of the Junior Police Call, Senior Police Call and local residents.

The programme supports the HKSAR Government's smart city vision and addresses the challenges of an ageing society. Through interactive experiences and competitions, it demonstrated how technology can bridge generations, encouraging the public to explore digital services, adopt tech applications, and engage in activities that benefit both physical and mental well-being, thereby fostering intergenerational digital inclusion.

### **Intergenerational Teams Explore Cutting-Edge Tech; Startup Solutions Enhance Well-being**

Elderly and youth representatives from four regions of Hong Kong Island teamed up for the "Intergenerational E-Sports Challenge", competing in a series of e-sports activities that embodied the spirit of intergenerational harmony and inclusion. By trying out innovative applications at game booths, participants experienced first-hand how emerging technologies can improve community well-being while fostering cross-generation exchange.

Seven Cyberport startup also set-up booths at the event, showcasing a range of solutions in health and inclusion technology, as well as sports and interactive experiences:

In health and inclusion technology, start-ups are harnessing advanced solutions to meet the needs of diverse communities. [Radiance](#) and [AESIR](#) apply AI, VR, and AR technologies to provide immersive rehabilitation for elderly stroke patients and learning support for students with special educational needs (SEN), making technology a powerful tool in therapy and education. Meanwhile, [KellyJohn](#) uses cross-platform motion-sensing game technology to break down age barriers, creating a virtual sports platform suitable for both elderly and children that promotes intergenerational interaction and supports physical and mental well-being.

In sports and interactive experiences, companies are focused on enhancing sporting enjoyment and sensory engagement. [Archon Wellness](#) and [Manna Pacific](#) are advancing smart sports development through gamified SportsTech and AI-powered campus system to boost motivation and improve teaching efficiency. [Plus One Dimension](#) and [Smart Interactive](#) demonstrated innovation in interactive technology, using proprietary 4D Capture and sensory technologies to bring unprecedented immersive experiences for the community and events, enriching the public's digital entertainment landscape.

The "Tech for All: Generational Skills Challenge" concluded successfully, underscoring Cyberport's role as Hong Kong's digital tech hub and highlighting the transformative potential of technology in addressing social challenges. Cyberport will continue to collaborate closely with partners across sectors, mobilise resources, foster cross-disciplinary collaboration to accelerate innovative, support Hong Kong's smart city development, and build a more inclusive society.

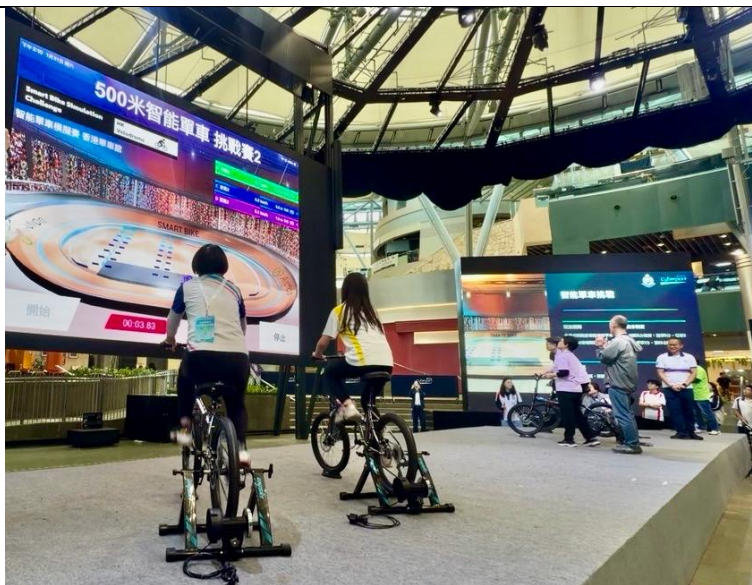
